The Story of the Pattern

Sizes: S (M, L)

Hand circumference: x (x, x) in [x (x, x) cm]

dpn(s) double pointed needle(s)

instep the arched middle portion of the human foot positioned between the toes and the ankle

K knit

K2tog knit 2 stitches together; right leaning decrease

K2P2 knit 2, purl 2 rib

M1R make one right; right leaning knit increase

M1L make one left; left leaning knit increase

P purl

PM place marker

rnd round

SM slip marker

SL slip

SSK slip two stitches knitwise, knit the two slipped stitches together through back loops; left leaning decrease

st(s) stitch(es)

wyb with yarn held behind the right needle

wyf with yarn held in front of the right needle

Pattern Instructions

Cast On

Using US x (x mm), or needle size to meet gauge, dpns or circular needle, long-tail cast on x (x, x) stitches. Join in the rnd by binding off 1 stitch. x (x, x) sts

- Use **knit** and **purl** when writing out instructions in sentences. For example, “With color A, knit until piece measures 1 in (2.5 cm).”
- Use **K** and **P** in row/round instructions. For example, “**Rnd 1:** K5, P2, K5, K remaining sts in rnd.”
- Use **stitches** when writing out instructions in sentences. Use **sts** in row/round instructions.
- Row and Rnd are always in **bold** with the number and colon. For example, “**Rnd 1:**” and “**Row 1:**”
- Mark only the first RS and WS rows. For example:
“**Row 1 (RS):** K all sts in rnd.
Row 2 (WS): P all sts in rnd.
Row 3: Repeat row 1.
Row 4: Repeat row 2.”
- Every time the stitch count changes, list the updated stitch count at the end of the row/round. For example, “Join in the rnd by binding off 1 stitch. 64 (72, 80) sts”

Finishing

- The following instructions may be modified depending on the knitted item.

After weaving in yarn ends, block your item by soaking in warm water with wool soap for 15-20 minutes. Follow wool wash instructions on whether to rinse or not. Without wringing, place wet item in towel and roll to remove excess water before laying flat to dry smoothing and shaping as desired. Air dry. Put on and enjoy!

Written Stitch Pattern Instructions

- Always box in stitch pattern instructions.

Main Pattern
Rnd 1: K3, P1, K3, P1, K3, P1, K remaining sts in rnd.
Rnd 2: K2, P1, K1, P1, K2, P1, K2, P1, K1, P1, K remaining sts in rnd.
Rnd 3: Repeat rnd 2.
Rnd 4: K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K remaining sts in rnd.
Rnd 5: Repeat rnd 4.
Rnd 6: K2, P1, K1, P1, K2, P1, K2, P1, K1, P1, K remaining sts in rnd.
Rnd 7: Repeat rnd 6.
Rnd 8: Repeat rnd 1.
Rnd 9: K3, P1, K2, P1, K1, P1, K2, P1, K remaining sts in rnd.
Rnd 10: Repeat rnd 9.
Rnd 11: K3, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K1, P1, K remaining sts in rnd.
Rnd 12: Repeat rnd 11.
Rnd 13: K3, P1, K2, P1, K1, P1, K2, P1, K remaining sts in rnd.
Rnd 14: Repeat rnd 13.

Chart

- All charts must have a key.
- Charts must be produced in Stitchmastery or cleanly in Excel.
- If multiple charts are used, each chart should be labeled distinctly in **bold**.
- Columns in chart are to be labeled numerically on both the top and bottom of the chart.

Schematic

- All schematics are to be drawn in Inkscape.
- All measurements on schematic are to be in inches and centimeters.

- Inches are to be listed as **in.** Centimeters are to be listed as **cm.**
- Circumference measurements are marked with a circle. Strait measurements are marked with a line dotted at both ends.
